Objectives of Alumni feedback:

Collecting feedback from alumni has three main objectives:

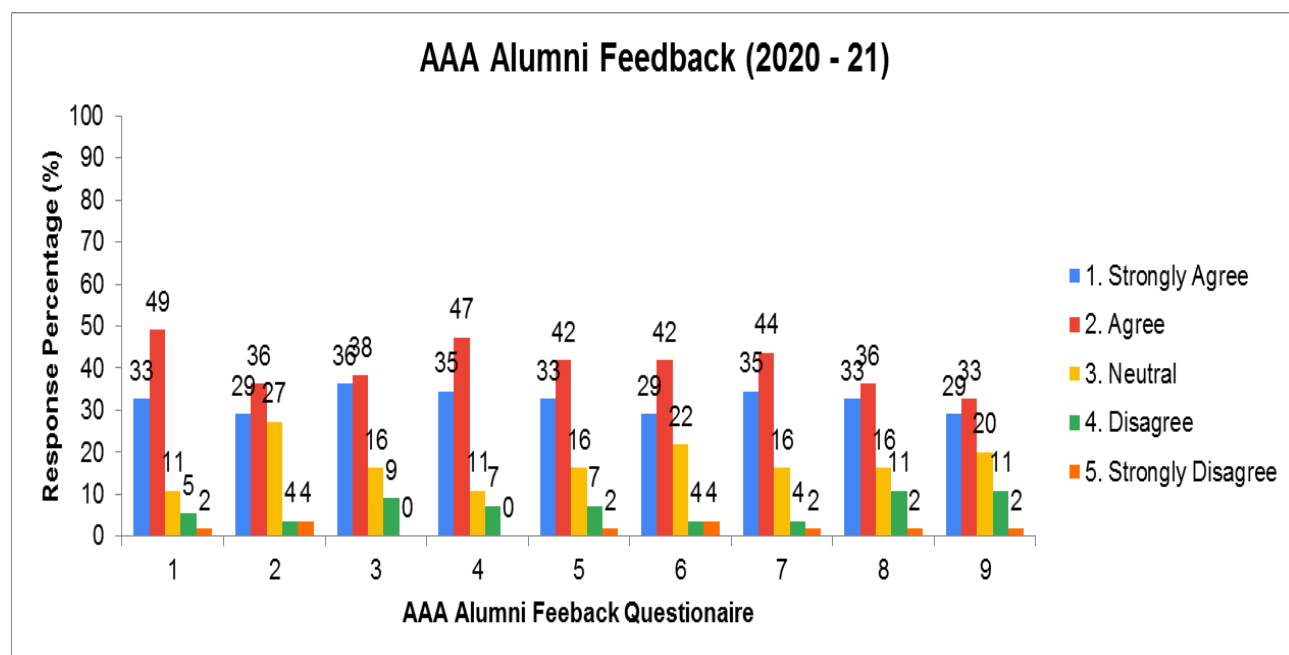
1. To inquire about the effectiveness of the curriculum and its structure as provided by the University and teaching methodology and the delivery of the syllabi.
2. To assess the response of alumni regarding resources such as library, books, digital resources and infrastructure with teaching aids.
3. To collect feedback on the impact of the institution on the career readiness of alumni.

Focus on the Alumni Feedback Form

The Alumni feedback form focuses on the following issues:

1. The overall depth of the curriculum was competent to equip you in the field.
2. The curriculum helped me in finding job opportunities and/or quality higher education.
3. The curriculum has relevance to real life situations.
4. The methodology employed by the faculty was appropriate for the curriculum.

5. The research orientation during the study was satisfactory
6. The external and internal evaluation methods were suitable for the syllabus.
7. The participatory learning and student involvement in the learning process
8. The activities/events conducted were relevant from the perspective of learning outcomes related to the curriculum.
9. The LMS and online aids used in the teaching-learning process were effective



Analysis and Outcome

AAA Cell and IQAC Alumni Feedback for 2020 – 21 (Responses)

1. From the above graph, the current curriculum is satisfactory to 33% of alumni who responded positive and strongly agreed, 49% agreed, 11% of them had a neutral opinion, and only 5% disagreed and 2% strongly disagreed to finding the curriculum competent to equip one in the given field.
2. When it comes to the efficacy of the curriculum in making the pupils job ready 29% parents strongly agreed and 36% of them agreed, whereas 27% of them picked neutral, and 4% disagreed and only 4% strongly disagreed. This shows that only 8% believes there need to be changes regarding the curriculum to make it more career oriented for the students.

3. For the relevance of the curriculum to real life 36% strongly agree that there is a balance between theory and application in curriculum, 38% agreed and 16% were neutral on this point, with 9% who disagreed and 0% who strongly disagreed to it.
4. As per the appropriacy of the methodology employed by the faculty for the curriculum, 35% strongly agreed, 47% agreed, nearly 11% responded neutral and 7% disagreed and 0% strongly disagreed.
5. On the orientation towards research in the teaching-learning process about 33% strongly agreed, 42% agreed, 16% was neutral and 7% disagreed and only 2% strongly disagreed. About 9% believe there need to more focus on research during their course of study.
6. When it comes to the suitability of evaluation methods 29% parents strongly agreed on it being satisfactory, 42% agreed on the same, 22% of them were neutral, while 4% disagreed and 4% strongly disagreed. about 8% seem to be unhappy with the evaluation methods.
7. When asked about the student involvement and participation in the learning process 35% alumni responded positively and strongly agreed, 44% agreed, 16% were neutral, 4% disagreed and only 2% strongly disagreed on this aspect.
8. When asked about the relevance of activities/events conducted from the perspective of learning outcomes related to the curriculum, 33% strongly agreed, 36% agreed and 16% was neutral and 11% disagreed and 2% strongly disagreed on the above aspect. At least 13% seem to think we need to conduct events that are more relevant to the outcome of the curriculum.
9. For the effectiveness of the LMS and online aids used in teaching 29% who Strongly agreed, 33% agreed and 20% was neutral, on the other have 11% disagreed and 3% strongly disagreed. About 13% see the need for improvement in LMS and online aids in teaching.

The overall feedback received is positive and suggests a satisfactory attitude of a good portion of the Alumni towards many aspect of college like curriculum, teaching-learning process and facilities, yet there is a small percentage that would like to see a change in the execution or curriculum, improvement in digital aids and other aspects of the teaching-learning experience.

Recommendation and Suggestions

1. LMS and online aids could be improved upon to make them more user friendly.
2. The faculty needs to connect the curriculum with the latest topics and industry requirements.
3. The curriculum and the learning process needs to be more student centric and geared towards making the students job-ready.
4. To introduce value added and certificate courses to be in line with the industrial demands.
