Employers' feedback has two main objectives:


- 1. To provide the overview regarding the curriculum and its structure as provided by the University and to incorporate value added and certificate-based courses.

Analysis and Outcome

IQAC Employers Feedback for 2021 – 22 (Responses)

- 1. From the above graph, the current curriculum is effective in developing analytical and problem-solving skills of the students is shown that 67% employers responded positive and agreed and 33% employers strongly agreed.
- 2. As per the analysis, the courses are pertinent to the respective industry has shown that 67% employers agreed and 33% of them strongly agreed.
- 3. As per the analysis on the level of knowledge acquired by students to meet their expectations, 33% employers from the analysis agreed on the level of knowledge acquired by students to meet the expectations, 33% employers strongly agreed, and 33% employers being neutral on this aspects.
- 4. From the graph it can interpreted that 67% employers strongly agreed on covering topics related to fundamentals and latest technology in their curriculum and 33% employers agreed on the same.
- 5. As per the analysis on implementing leadership skills, 67% employers strongly agreed on the above analysis, zero% employer agreed and nearly 33% being neutral.
- 6. From the above graph, the observation on curriculum to include value added courses/ soft skill training/domain specific electives for enhancing constructive learning shows about 67% employers strongly agreed, zero% agreed and being 33% neutral.

- 7. From the analysis, the curriculum facilitates an overall holistic development of the student shows 33% employers strongly agreed on the having overall holistic development and 67% employers agreed on the same.
- 8. As per the analysis on the curricular and non-curricular initiatives taken up by the college have helped the students to attain the required competency level, it shows that 67% employers responded positively and agreed with the efforts taken and 33% strongly agreed on this aspect.
- 9. Based on the current curriculum, the students are open to challenges and learning new things showed that 33% employers agreed on this aspect of students learning from challenges and new experiences, and 67% strongly agreed on the above aspects.

Recommendation and Suggestions

- 1. The overall feedback received is positive and suggests a satisfactory attitude towards many aspects of college like curriculum, teaching-learning process, and facilities, yet there is a small percentage that would like to see a change by way of covering topics related to fundamentals and latest technology in their curriculum.
